## Saturday, August 11, 2018

8:00 a.m.-Noon

### Chris Pawlowski, Garrison Fire & Rescue, and Doug Whitaker (Retired), Syracuse Fire Department – Stabilization and Extrication Techniques (Hands-On Training)

This four-hour program will start with the establishing command, size-up and setting up an extrication scene. Attendees will learn about vehicle safety systems; what they are; where they are located; how to look for them; and when to disable them. Also discussed will be the proper techniques to stabilize a vehicle using the equipment carried on the apparatus today. Are your tools ready to cut the metals of the modern automobiles? A review of forces, weight and age of the hydraulic tools will help you with plans to replace or upgrade your equipment in the future. Alternate techniques shown with hydraulic tools while operating on vehicles in several positions will be demonstrated. Pre-registration is highly recommended for this program. Lunch is included.

### Assistant Chief Joe Pronesti, Elyria (Ohio) Fire Department – Lost in the Fog of the Fireground: Command and Control for the Small Department

This program will discuss mistakes of being "sidetracked" on arrival, which could lead to a serious problem on the fireground. Do not let yourself be sidetracked at your next serious event. This workshop relates this concept to the fireground and helps officers avoid the mistake of "getting lost in the fog." The focus is on the critical points of size-up, reviewing case histories and improving "vision," so officers can see through the fog of the fireground and provide a more effective and safer environment for those under their command.

### David Lewis, Odenton (Maryland) Volunteer Fire Co. – See Something-Say Something: Emergency Services Role in Homeland Security

Each day, fire and EMS responders serve their communities while performing the core functions of prevention, response and investigation. In the course of their duties, personnel may observe activities that could serve as indicators of potential criminal or terrorist activity. Personnel may also be subjected to incidents that threaten their personal security. This presentation will provide an overview of the Homeland Security mission and discuss how emergency services providers can partner with law enforcement to meet local Homeland Security mission requirements.
