



Aquarium of Niagara

Located just a short walk from the Maid of the Mist, the Aquarium of Niagara boasts more than 120 species, including playful penguins, rescued seals and sea lions, mesmerizing jellyfish and more! In addition to hands-on animal interactions with sharks and stingrays, watch daily feedings and educational presentations, sea lion shows, and expert talks.

Herschell Carrousel Factory Museum

Almost half of the hand-carved wooden carousels still working in the U.S. and Canada trace their origins to the Herschell Carrousel Factory. Learn all about the beginnings of amusement parks and the history behind it at the Herschell Carrousel Factory Museum in North Tonawanda. The museum features vintage carousels and 1950s-era rides with cars, fire trucks and helicopters.




